Summary of Forum Breakout Sessions

1. The Fundamentals of Evaluation for Community-Academic Partnerships and Projects

This first session on Evaluation will cover the basics of evaluation for community-academic partnerships and projects. Topics will include: the elements of evaluation; a description of Community-Based Participatory Approach (CBPA) in evaluation; and detailed examples of CBPA to evaluation.

2. Community -Academic Research Partnerships: Successes, Challenges, and Reflections – Finding a Partner

For this session, we invite academics and community members to bring potential research ideas. You will hear from other faculty members and Community-based organizations (CBOs) who will share their experiences. There are unique issues for both community and those in academic institutions as they engage as partners in research. Hear about their lessons learned. This is a networking opportunity for potential research partners for your project – or to share your research ideas to be matched with an interested partner at some point in the future.

3. Using “Big Data” to Analyze Health Disparities (Part 1 and Part 2)
